It's deeper than just diapers and wipes...

I wanted to share a story from the pantry this past week. It was a windy and rainy day; honestly, a day to stay cozy inside. A young mother walked into the church. I recognized her as a familiar face; a quiet, friendly mother who has visited the pantry often. On one side of this mother stood her toddler who was carefully taking her time on the basement steps while holding on tightly to her mother's hand. On the other side of the mother, a newborn carrier swung balanced on her arm with the coziest baby inside, fast asleep.

The mother filled out the appropriate paperwork and presented her two forms of identification. As the pantry volunteer looked up the child's log sheet, she pointed out to me that this mother was making her third visit for November that day. Surprisingly, this has never happened before, but our policy states each child can be serviced only twice monthly. I began to tell the mother this would be her third visit for November. She embarrassingly stopped me while grabbing her child's hand and said, "Oh my goodness, I'm so sorry. I thought it was December today... I'll come back next week." As she began to turn up the stairs, I stopped her. "You've always had the correct paperwork and I can see you've attended the pantry twice monthly since we opened. You've also carried two children into a building during poor weather. How about this: take your bundles today and just return once, rather than twice, during the month of December."

The mother put her free hand to her face, buried her head, and began to cry. My heart ached for her as it was evident, she was overcome with emotion. With another embarrassed look on her face, she quickly grabbed her things to head to her car. Scott carried the bundles while I carried that sweet baby's carrier so mama would have her hands free for her toddler. As I walked beside the mother, I felt God's nudge to encourage her. "Motherhood can be so hard, but you are doing a wonderful job," I said softly. She couldn't speak as the tears continued to flow, but she shook her head in understanding and showed us to her car.

As Scott and I walked back into the church, neither one of us had words for what just had happened. All the scheduling, organizing, bundling, and grant preparations of the last several months flashed before my eyes. As I fought back tears myself, Scott reminded me, "This is our why."

...And that is why I share with you today. I am overwhelmingly honored that I attend a church that's ready to do God's work. Sometimes, I'm lucky enough to get a front row seat to watch it affect those that need it the most. As you may know, the number of diapers we give in a bundle (1 bundle = 3 diapers a day) is not the full supply a child needs; parents must supplement. Two days after the mother visited the pantry, she returned to the church. Previously, she had purchased a small number of diapers, but as her son grew, the diapers became too small. She was back at the church to donate the unused diapers to our pantry so another mother could be blessed.

Folks, God's work in that mother goes way deeper than just diapers and wipes. Keep being a blessing... these Jackson County parents need you.
