I want to invite you to a gathering on **Sunday evening**, **August 4th at 6:00 p.m.** at the church to begin to think about all those decisions that have to be made at one of the most difficult times of life. Having a plan in place ahead of time can make a huge difference.

Luke Nolting, President of Spurgeon Funeral Home in Brownstown, will help those attending understand what needs to happen when a loved one dies. Who do we call? What information is it important to have on hand? What services does a funeral home provide?

As a second part of the evening, I will spend time talking about the considerations of a service of worship honoring a loved one. What should be included in the service? Should the service be a "funeral" or a "memorial" service?

I understand these are difficult conversations to have, but they are also important to have. I hope you will mark that date on your calendar and join us at the church.

Summer is here! This should be a fun and exciting time for families, right?!

Not always. For some families, summer means schools are closed, child care costs increase, and grocery bills double or even triple. Many parents have to stretch their dollars even farther when summer arrives. At the pantry, we are seeing a summer surge of families (not necessarily new families) needing diapers. In the first TWELVE HOURS of open pantry shifts in June, we distributed 178 bundles. That equates to 7,112 diapers and pull-ups out the door! We ask you to prayerfully consider how you might be able to support the pantry's families this summer.

A few ideas:

- 1. Pray daily for the families that have to make their dollars stretch even farther during the summer months. Likewise, pray for the children who have worried or stressed out parents.
- 2. Consider working a shift to meet our families and give them a friendly face of encouragement.
- 3. Purchase a box or two of diapers or wipes during your next shopping trip. Size 6 diapers is always the most requested size by pantry families.
- 4. As always, the pantry is committed to our community and the serious concern of diaper-need that our families face as they raise their little ones. Consider joining us as a financial supporter to not only offset this summer's surge, but to ensure Sweet Cheeks is a blessing to our community for years to come! Have questions or want to chat?
